**School 33's Annual Open Studio Tour Returns October 7-8,
Opening Doors of 130+ Artists' Studios Throughout Baltimore City**

Baltimore's artists are opening their studios, and you're invited! School 33 Art Center's 29th annual **Open Studio Tour presented by Bank of America** returns **Saturday, October 7 & Sunday, October 8, 2017** from **10am to 6pm**, with a kickoff event on **Friday, October 6**. During those days, more than 130 artists throughout Baltimore City open their studios to the public. Visitors can meet artists, learn more about their process, explore their space and purchase original works of art. Open Studio Tour features artists working in various media including painting, sculpture and photography. **A full list of participating studios is below and can be found on www.school33.org**. Open Studio Tour is held in conjunction with Free Fall Baltimore and National Arts & Humanities Month, both taking place October 1-31. School 33's Open Studio Tour is produced by the Baltimore Office of Promotion & The Arts and presented by Bank of America.

On Friday, October 6 from 6 to 8pm, the Youth Resiliency Institute hosts a free Open Studio Tour kickoff event at the Cherry Hill Homes Community Center, 2700 Spelman Road, Baltimore, MD 21225. During the kickoff reception, attendees can meet artists living or working in the Cherry Hill community, view their work and learn about art advocacy in the neighborhood. Live music will be provided by Youth Resiliency Institute master artist-in-residence Abu The Flutemaker, and event attendees will be treated to a sampling of West African cuisine and other light refreshments. Immediately following the reception, there will be a cross-generational panel discussion focused on the intersection of community self-determination and the arts in Cherry Hill. The panel discussion will be moderated by Youth Resiliency Institute executive director Fanon Hill.
