Top of the World hours are extended from Memorial Day through Labor Day

(Baltimore, MD) **The Baltimore Office of Promotion & The Arts (BOPA)** announces that the **Top of the World Observation Level** located on the 27th Floor of the Baltimore World Trade Center at 401 E. Pratt Street will open seven days a week from Memorial Day through Labor Day. In addition to the stunning 360-degree views of Baltimore City, your ticket grants you access to the 9/11 Memorial of Maryland, the Top Shop gift shop, and the current exhibition on view at Top of the World. Now through August 21, you can see Lauren R. Lyde’s solo show, “The View from Here,” at the Gallery in the Sky.

Tickets to visit Top of the World can be purchased in person in the lobby of the World Trade Center. Admission is \$8 for teens and adults, \$6 for seniors (60+) and active military with ID, \$5 for children ages 3–12, and free for children under three. Ticket sales end 30 minutes prior to close.
